EMS:

E.D.:

- Review the current c-spine immobilization and clearance practices

O.R.:

- Describe how to prepare your O.R. for a major trauma case and other special considerations specific to the trauma patient in the O.R.
- Review the importance of intra-op communication and identification of key points necessary for successful patient transitions

Inpatient:

- Identify how each specialty helps the trauma patient progress and how to provide interdisciplinary care to maximize recovery and avoid complications
- Recognize issues related to pain management in the trauma patient with multiple injuries and how to address these
